Collect **well-worn** textiles (as long as they are not wet or mildewed), put them in a plastic bag or box. CLEARLY mark the words “Textiles for shredding” and donate to Goodwill. Seattle Goodwill will recycle old clothing scraps into industrial wipes (cleaning cloths) for industrial buyers.
